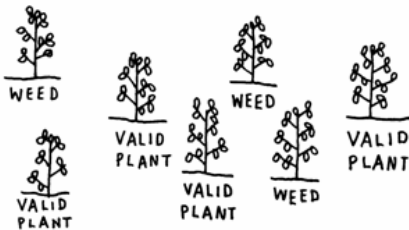

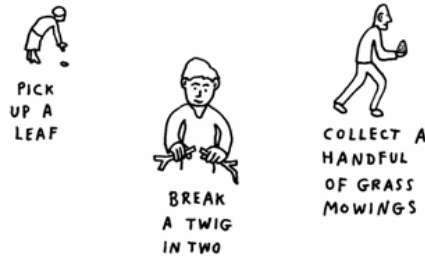


HOW TO TELL THE DIFFERENCE
